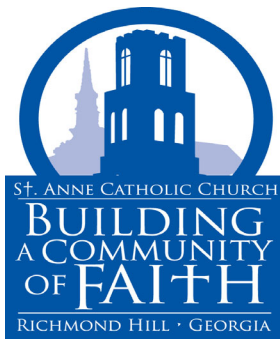

BUILDING CAMPAIGN UPDATE

HOW WILL THE MONEY BE RAISED FOR A NEW CHURCH?

We are actively planning a Capital Campaign to build our new church. A Capital Campaign Committee has been established by Father Smith. Rick Padaszynski, a parishioner, is chair of this committee. WHY DON'T WE PAY OFF OUR CURRENT DEBT BEFORE WE BUILD A NEWCHURCH?

The current debt is being retired through our normal operating budget and through special donations. Throughout the past four years, we have reduced our debt by more than \$1 million. We have had expansion programs in the parish since the early 1990s. Through the generosity of our parish and the good stewardship of our Parish Council, we have been able to carry this debt responsibly and reduce it as scheduled. Taking on debt is a normal means by which parishes expand, but we cannot take on the entire debt for the new church. We must raise a substantial amount of money through a Capital Campaign to responsibly finance the project.

HOW WILL THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN BE SUPPORTED?

Every Catholic household in Richmond Hill will have the opportunity to prayerfully consider a gift to the Capital Campaign. Gifts from the community and from part-time residents will also be welcomed.

Revisions to the texts of the Mass and how it will effect the Mass:


On Sunday, November 27th, 2011 (the 1st Sunday of Advent), the Mass in every Catholic Church in the United States will change in accordance with and under the direction of the USCCB (The United States Council of Catholic Bishops). The bishop's of the United States are responding to the directives of Pope John Paul II in his Third Edition of the Roman Missal.

Over the next few weeks in anticipation of the changes which will be brought forth, I will be writing in the parish bulletin as well as addressing not only the changes, but the why behind them from the pulpit. I would suggest that all families in the parish go to the website USCCB.org and go to the tab for instruction regarding the revision and implementation of the 3rd Edition of the Roman Missal.

How will the words change in the Mass? What will it sound like? What does it mean?

The words we use, most particularly in the Mass, when the community of faith communally expresses prayers to our God are important. Please take the time to read and seek to understand the implication and the means of these words. Please remember these changes were put forth and directed by Pope John Paul II and confirmed by the USCCB (United States Council of Catholic Bishops). It is these words, in union with the one Church throughout all the world in the celebration of the Mass that confirms our Catholic faith identity.
